When he turned his back to leave Samuel God gave him another heart. And all these signs came to pass that day. I Samuel 10:9

Heart to Heart

When Saul was anointed king over Israel there was a very powerful meeting with the prophet Samuel. There were some specific prophetic words that were spoked over Saul which gave new direction to his life. They prepared him to be the king of Israel. There was one more thing left to be done that day. God gave him another heart. Saul received a heart that had the capacity to to walk in the calling God had now given him. This is essential. Gaining some discernment and understanding about what God wants you to do is always necessary but not enough to get the job done. God also supplies the capacity to do it. In Saul's case God gave him another heart so that he had the ability to carry out his calling. As you may recall, Saul did not stay faithful to that, but for some time was an able king of Israel because of the provision of God.

Our Hearts

God's desire is to give us a heart that will have the capacity to do what he has asked us to do. We may at times struggle and fail in living out our calling. That does not mean God has not provided the capacity to answer his call. It means that we lean on his mercy as well as his provision. What do you think God has called you to do? It may be a large thing, or it may be a small matter. Whatever it is it will be very significant in the kingdom of God. Do you have a heart to carry out that calling? Would you ask God to give you another heart with the capacity to do what He has asked you to do?
