### House Or Neighborhood?

The photo above is a neighborhood that could be almost in any region in America. There are countless neighborhoods that look like this one. There are neighborhoods that are different from this one, but are still neighborhoods none-the-less. The one thing all neighborhoods have in common is that they are a collection of families, household, and other businesses or institutions. When I moved into the neighborhood where I live with my family a few years ago we were welcomed by other neighbors. They all commented on our house and then some other aspects of the neighborhood. What they did not do was invite us to move out of the house we just moved into and move into one of their houses. That would be weird at best. We tend to do that, however, with people who are not yet in a church. We invite them to come to "our house," "our family," our church building to worship God. We view the church as one family instead of a neighborhood of families.

### **Building Neighborhoods**

One of the practices in the early church was to go from house to house. Each household was a much larger extended family than what we see in our culture today. The early disciples did not try to always get everyone into one family. They found out what would make the gospel real to each household and and invited them to embrace that so the whole household would begin to follow Jesus. Essentially, they built a "neighborhood" instead of a "family." How do you see things? Do you want your church to be one big family or a neighborhood of families, households, and institutions? What is God impressing upon you about that right now?
