John 1:14, The Message

Following Jesus

The paraphrase of John 1:14 above may not be familiar to many of us. The version we know better reads something like this, "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us." The picture of Jesus moving into our neighborhood and getting to now the others who live there is a very helpful picture. It points to a shift that churches would do well to consider. That shift is from making church relevant to engaging with the community. Notice this does not mean to make the church irrelevant. It points out that we can do very well to engage with the community as a higher priority in our ways and practices. One of the main reasons is that we are following Jesus ways and practices when we do engage with the community.

How Do We Engage The Community?

One way to engage the community is to find ways to be friends with those who live around the church building. That would mean finding ways to get to know them without any expectations that they visit Sunday morning or become members. Just getting to know them so we can be good friends and neighbors is an excellent beginning. Who knows, God might be at work in some powerful ways in the neighborhood. We don't want to miss that by seeing how they can help our church. In the meantime, we might find that they would be open to an invitation to Christmas Eve or some other special service.
