Shifting Our Focus

Last Sunday we looked at Jesus as our King. The more we get to know and follow our King the more our lives will be transformed. Sometimes that means a shift in our focus that we did not anticipate. As we launch into Advent next Sunday we will find that waiting on Jesus will produce shifts in our thinking and transformations in our lives. For today and the coming season of Advent I would like to share with you some of the shifts that the Spirit of God is bringing to us. They can be disruptive at times, but they will always lead us to walk in step with Jesus our King.

This Shift Is Happening . . .

... from average Sunday attendance as our most important metric to the number of people in the community engaging with the Holy Spirit. Its no secret that Sunday attendance in America is declining. It is also the case that many of us who have been able to be weekly attenders find it more and more difficult to attend every week due to other dynamics in our lives (work, out of town family visits, other non-profit activities, etc.). When Jesus came into Jericho and was met by a crowd he focused on one man-Zaccheaus. Although Zaccheaus was despised by the crowd Jesus focused most of his attention on him that day. Zaccheaus wanted to connect with Jesus. He is a model of what it is to engage with the Holy Spirit. While I cannot assess the mood of the crowd my suspicion is that the crowd was there to be inspired. Zaccheaus was there to relate to and even follow Jesus. The temptation we have in our churches is to put our emphasis on the size of the crowd that came to be inspired. The emphasis of Jesus is to

focus on those who want to engage with the Holy Spirit. What if that were the main thing we counted in our churches? I wonder if our attendance would actually grow if we shifted our focus. I know that we would grow in our discipleship. I have seen the growth of members of St. Francis who take steps to engage with and rely on the Holy Spirit to pursue the ministry Jesu has asked them to do. It is life transforming. How will you engage with the Holy Spirit today?
