

The Three Days

Tomorrow starts the Three Days of Holy Week which depict the death burial and resurrection of Jesus. The formal name for these days is the Triduum. It begins with Maundy Thursday, goes through Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and then Easter. Maundy Thursday is the night he was arrested. Good Friday is the day he was killed. Holy Saturday is the day he was buried, and Easter, of course, is the day Jesus rose from the dead. He took that path for us. As we grow closer to him we will find that we take a similar path in our discipleship.

Death, Burial, and Resurrection

As we follow Jesus it is easy to be thinking that because we are following Jesus our lives will be blessed. Usually what we mean by blessed is that we will have a good life without struggle or pain because God is blessing us. However, as we follow Jesus we will find that we fill walk the same path he walked. Our growth in discipleship will often take a path of death, burial, and resurrection. We will die to ourselves first, see our old nature buried, and then rise to new life in Jesus. This will happen over and over again in our lives. It is the path to becoming more and. more like him. It is also the path upon which we are equipped to do the kinds of things Jesus did in ministry. Following Jesus will always call for that kind of death, burial, and resurrection in our lives. How is God calling you to that path today? When you worship over this next Three Days see how God is leading you in that path of death, burial, and resurrection.
