

Have You Noticed?

It is difficult to disagree these days. So often we see people saying demeaning things, or worse, about people with whom they disagree. So often we hear things said that are personally degrading about someone who is on the other side, in a different camp,or belongs to a different party. The actual substance of the disagreement on policy or ideas is covered over by the personal attacks leveled against someone who is on the other side. I am not suggesting that we be nice to each other, although that is a good idea. It is impossible to keep that up all the time, especially when our culture is so polarized and accusatory. I have a different suggestion.

Following Jesus In The Presence Of Our Enemies

I believe that Jesus is calling everyone to follow Him. He is even calling our enemies, the ones who are on the other side, the ones we are tempted to demean, to follow Him. My suggestion is this: Try to see what Jesus thinks and feels about someone you want insult or demean in some way. What is Jesus doing in the life of that person? Can you see what Jesus sees when you look at that person? Can you do that for your political opponents? Can you do that for those who have insulted you or hurt you in some way. Can you do that for people who have been unjust towards your family or your race? Can you follow Jesus in the presence of your enemies by seeing them as He sees them?
