I would not choose to have that kind of spiritual experience. But Jesus did. There must be something I need to catch here.

I Am A Back Seat Driver

I picture being filled with the Spirit and being led by the Spirit as something which should be easy, uplifting, and encouraging. It should be a "blessing." I have a bias that if things are not going well it is because I am not being led by the Spirit, have committed some kind of sin, and am generally "off." Apparently, that is not the case. If I am going to be led by the Spirit then it is the Spirit of God who decides where to go and what it will be like. My response is to follow where I am being led and lean on the Spirit of God for the power to go. Instead, a lot of the time I am a back seat driver telling the Spirit of God how to lead, where to go, and what to provide. Maybe I should imitate Jesus more on this one.
