

For in you, O Lord, have I fixed my hope . . . Psalm 38:15

The Practice of Hope

Usually, when I think of living a Christian life I think of what I am supposed to do. Then, because I have thought about it for some years, even taught it, I remember that living a Christian life is more about who I am than what I do. As true as that is the whole idea of being instead of doing can become very slippery and confusing. Yet, the verse cited above from the Psalms this morning points to a way that is clearer. When I fix my hope on Jesus instead of on my ability to follow Jesus I am on my way to being transformed. It does bring up another question, though. How do I fix my hope on Jesus? How can I make that my practice?

Fixing Hope

I think there is a way to fix my hope on Jesus so that I am living a Christina life. The main approach is this: It is more important to spend time on Jesus transforming our character than it is for Jesus to teach us what to do. When I think that God has prompted me to do something, or I am thinking I have finally figured out what to do about something I can very easily want to accomplish all of that on my own power. That may increase my skill somewhat, but it will not develop my character. A better step is to to receive what God is giving me, return it to God so that it can be transformed in his presence, and then received back into my own life. The practice of giving it up before trying to accomplish it will do more to develop my character to be like the character of Jesus than anything else.

From This Point On

What has God given you to do? Do you have an answer to a problem you have been experiencing? Do you sense that God is prompting you to do something new? What ever it may be would you give it up to God first before you do anything? Will you let God further transform your character in waiting? The challenge is this: Do we want to do something for Jesus or become like Jesus?
