A Familiar Miracle

Many of of are very familiar with the report of this miracle we come across in the readings appointed for today. We can be so familiar that we can easily miss one of the parts that relates directly to the way we live our lives. It is easy to skim over the story, review the thoughts we may have had about it before, and then move on to something else. There is, however, something in here for us to take up everyday.

Distribution

It is normal to assume that Jesus blessed the bread and fish and then started distributing the miraculous multiplication himself to the crowd. That would be in line with the way we think of most leaders, especially pastoral leaders. Luke points out one part of this story that is easy to miss. The disciples distributed the miraculous multiplication of food to the crowd. Jesus gave them the blessed bread and fish and the 12 began to take it around to everyone. Did it multiply in their hands as they gave it out? Maybe. I would think probably. The challenge for us is this: We want to help people and provide for people out of our own resources, experience, and plans. Jesus wants us to give to others what we have received from Him. The blessing and provision we received is multiplied as we give it away to others as Jesus directs us to do. Our responsibility is to receive from Him what we give away in His Name. That is challenging. It means leaning on Jesus, trusting Jesus, and waiting on Jesus when I can do it faster myself. In the end, though, I think Jesus' provision will be better than mine.

How is Jesus asking you to receive from Him today? To whom is He asking you to give away what you have received.
