

What About You?

Now there are a variety of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but the same God who empowers them all in everyone.

I Corinthians 12:4-6

Gift Colonization

This is a very familiar passage from Morning Prayer this morning. It raises some thoughts for me. Have you ever come across a local church which for the most part is organized around one ministry? For example, a church may be committed deeply to social justice because of the prophetic gifting of the leader. Or, a church may be committed to a varied, rich program of Christian education because of the teaching gift of the leader. Or, a church may be almost completely focused on the pastoral needs and concerns of the members because of the pastoral gifting of the leader. You are probably able to think of other examples. What can happen is the ministry of the whole local fellowship is organized to support and mirror the gifting of the leader. I call this gift colonization. There really is not anything morally wrong or inherently sinful about that kind of situation. But, I have to openly admit it does bother me.

As the Spirit Wills

What bothers me is that the Spirit of God gifts all Christians. Everyone has an essential, significant part in the Christian life. Everyone counts. As John Wimber used to say, "Everyone gets to play." God has given each and everyone varied, beautiful gifts. The role and responsibility of the church is to provide the ways for those gifts to be employed, manifested, put to use, and made powerful. It is the primary role and responsibility of church leaders to equip people for the use of any and all of the gifts God gives to them. Such work is a part of carrying out the disciple-making task Jesus calls us to do.

Just to be clear- it is not the primary role and responsibility of church leaders to save the church from decline, come up with new ideas, or launch new programs, etc. It is the primary role and responsibility of church leaders to equip, build up, encourage, train, cheerlead, release, and guide everyone in the minsitry God has called and gifted each person to do.

A Suggestion

Instead of asking your church leader (pastor, vicar, rector, preacher) what you can do to help the church or your leader's ministry, why not ask a question like this, "would you help me carry out my gifting, ministry, or calling better?". Maybe you need to ask a more basic question, "Would you

help me find the ministry, gifting, or calling God has for me?". To know and pursue your calling using the gifts God gives you may actually cause your church to grow. Who knows, maybe the leader of your church has been praying to be asked questions like that.
